Taize Music & The Season of Lent

We are grateful to Father David for leading a Taize service for each class during the season of Lent. The children had an opportunity to listen to Taize music and reflect on scripture. KS2 focused on Matthew 4:1-11. The Temptation of Jesus. KS1 focused on John 15:12-13. My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you. The children reflected on what these passages meant to them as they quietly prayed and listened to two Taize chants. We thank Father David for his continued support.

During Lent, the children had an opportunity to reflect on the Stations of the Cross. Their knowledge and understanding of the Easter story was enriched by watching the Year 5 inspirational performance of the Passion Play. Well done Year 5 you were amazing! Their Easter Gardens were once again very creative and really highlighted the key events of the Easter story too.

Thank you to everyone who returned the Catholic Children's Society Boxes. We are pleased to say that we raised an incredible £1050.69 for this charity. Well done to Logan in Y3, Francesca in Y5 and Lea in Y6 who independently organised and raised funds to support this charity.

The Oscar Romero Award

It was a great pleasure to escort some of our RE Ambassadors to St George's Cathedral in March to celebrate the Oscar Romero Mass with Archbishop John Wilson. The children enjoyed meeting the Archbishop and seeing the wonderful Oscar Romero Cross situated in the cathedral. It was a truly special event as we were also awarded the Oscar Romero Participator certificate. The award shows how we focus on putting our Catholic Social Teaching Principles into action in our school and throughout our local and wider community.

Catholic Social Teaching Principles

The Catholic Social Teaching Principles are based around the Church's belief that we can all make a difference in our world and make it a better place for all. These teachings are rooted in Scripture and especially in the teachings of Jesus found in the Gospels. Christ shows us how to walk in his footsteps, bringing love and care to those both near and far. We hope to make present in our unjust world, the justice, love and peace of God through our words and actions. At St James' we promote the Catholic Social Teaching Principles (CST) by each class focusing on one principle in each year group. The seven principles of social teaching that we will explore at St James' are:

Year Group	Catholic Social Teaching Principle
Reception	Stewardship. Caring for our world
Year 1	Peace
Year 2	Solidarity
Year 3	Option for the Poor
Year 4	Human Dignity
Year 5	Distributive Justice
Year 6	Subsidiarity

We explore these principles in our classes but also together through our curriculum, prayer and liturgy experiences and through our everyday actions. It is through this work that we achieved the Participator Level of the Oscar Romero Award.

The Lunchtime Holy Club

The KS2 Lunchtime Holy Club has now moved to Tuesday lunchtime. The RE Ambassadors lead this group. There are opportunities for the children to read and listen to the Word of the Lord, reflect on its meaning, listen to music and enter into spontaneous prayer. Well done my RE Ambassadors for organising this club.

Catholic Virtues

Last term, pupils nominated and celebrated examples of the Catholic virtues; patience and honesty in action throughout the school. Well done to all those who received nominations. In the summer term, we will focus on determination and self-discipline. Examples of nominations are displayed on the Catholic virtues display board in the hall. The tea party will also celebrate examples of these virtues in action. Teachers nominate pupils in their class for this award.

Rosary Week will be held at St James' in the week beginning Monday 6th May. A Rosary Club will be organised before the beginning of the school day. We are also looking to have our May procession after Mass on Thursday 23rd May. More details of both events to follow shortly.
