The meeting, held in the KS2 gazebo to comply with social distancing measures, commenced with a welcome back from Mrs Deasy after such a long period away from one another.

Mrs Deasy explained to all present that the Garden Council had now changed its name to that of the Eco Committee and that it now had additional responsibilities for other areas within the school including recycling and redevelopment of green spaces to support the school's membership of its partner organisations, such as the Eco School initiative. In addition, as requested, we would be growing more flowers in and around the school garden this year.

All present were then asked to put forward any ideas that their classes have had for the school garden.

Dylan and Hugo quickly responded that although a cherry tree was possible, it was not warm enough for us to grow watermelons. Mrs Deasy confirmed that she would arrange for a cherry tree to be purchased from garden funds.

Mrs Deasy concluded the meeting with thanks and said that this year would be full of competitions and activities for all across the school and as a committee, they would be very busy!
