## Headteacher's Message

Dear Parents,

Happy New Year if I have not seen you yet this term! I hope you and your families all had a good Christmas.

During the Christmas holidays the PTA paid for new flooring to be put into the KS2 Gazebo and we are very grateful for this. It will ensure that the gazebo lasts for many more years to come.

We have all returned to school with renewed energy ready to start the new term. Lots of exciting things are planned and the children have already settled down to their learning which is a joy to see.

Pope Francis has declared 2024 as a special Year of Prayer and we have been talking to the children about different kinds of prayer.

This term the Catholic Virtue that we are focusing on is **PATIENCE.** Children will be nominating one another in assemblies when they see this in others.

In KS2 children will be bringing home their Reading Passports. Please encourage the children to take part and to read a range of genres so that they can aim for a Bronze, Silver or Gold Certificate at the end of term. They are due back in on Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> March ready for the assembly where we will be awarding the certificates on 26<sup>th</sup> March.

Class teachers have been sending home letters this week that explain the topics that your children will be studying this term and suggesting ways in which you can help. Please remember to contact class teachers if you have any questions as they are always happy to help. You are very welcome to catch staff at the end of the day or via the office.

We were really pleased to welcome our extracurricular clubs back this term. Harlequins Dance Club performed for children this week. If you have any questions about any of our clubs please do contact the office.



KS2 Collective Worship this week was led by Year 4 who reflected on the Bible scripture: Matthew 21:33-43



As the weather continues to be cold and children are coming to school with hats and gloves we ask that you ensure that all items of clothing are clearly labelled with your child's name. We already seem to have lots of hats and gloves that we do not know who they belong to.

I wanted to share some information regarding our adverse weather and school closure policy. I will always endeavour to keep our school open and operating as normal. However, my first priority will always be to ensure the health, safety and wellbeing of pupils, families and staff. Therefore, in the event of severe adverse weather such as snow it may be necessary for me to decide to close the school for reasons of safety. The school will only be closed if one or more of the following conditions apply: there are insufficient staff to keep the school running safely; conditions on site are dangerous or conditions are considered to be too hazardous to travel. If I am unable to open the school on a morning I will issue a message to be communicated to parents via twitter and email as early as possible. The message will be sent when I have been able to speak to staff and do a site visit. Hopefully, we will not have any extreme snow and we can remain fully open this winter.

I hope that you enjoy reading this term's RE Newsletter that Mrs Wilson has attached. It explains what we will be doing this term to deepen the children's faith.

As you know, we are committed to making sure that each of our children gets the best possible start to life and one way that we can do this is through ensuring good school attendance. It is vital that children attend school, on time, every day in order to gain the greatest benefit from their education.

10 whole days of school have been missed if a child's attendance is 95%.

20 whole days of school have been missed if a pupil's attendance is 90%.

Attendance below 90% is seen as persistent absenteeism by the DfE and we are asked to report any to the local authority. Please remember that there are two sessions each school day, a morning and an afternoon, and that if a child is

absent for the day they have missed two sessions. If a child is unwell in the morning and feels better later they can come into school ready for the afternoon session. For every day of school missed by a child it will reduce their attendance by 0.5%. Holidays in term time will not be authorised. Children only attend school for 190 days out of 365 which leaves 175 days for holidays.

Please see the attached letter about children continuing to receive a free school lunch next academic year. Even though your child will receive their free school meals automatically, it is still vitally important to complete Bromley's registration form in case your child is eligible for extra funding for their school from the Government, worth over £1,300 per year. This will ensure you will also receive any other benefits you may be entitled to, like food vouchers during the holidays. Please see the following link:

Please remember that if you are applying for your child to start Reception Class in September 2023 that the closing date for applications is Monday 15th January.




