Year 4 had a great trip to the BAPS Shri Swaminarayan Mandir in Neasden on Thursday. The children watched an aarti prayer in the Mandir, watch a mini movie about how the temple was made, explore some of the shrines and visit the Exploring Hinduism exhibit. It was wonderful to visit such a beautiful and peaceful place and the children really enjoyed their day.





Year 5 led KS2 Collective Worship this week on the theme of compassion.



On Friday, a volunteer from The Alzheimer's Society visited Year 5 to raise awareness of dementia. They helped the pupils understand the five important messages which are:

Dementia is not a natural part of ageing.

Dementia is caused by a disease of the brain.

Dementia is not just about losing your memory—it can affect thinking, communicating and doing everyday tasks.

It is possible to live well with dementia. There is more to a person than the dementia.

Year 5 are now looking forward to visiting the Memory Cafe at St James' Church on Tuesday 7th November.



On Thursday, Reception Class held their Grandparent's Harvest Tea Party. The children asked questions about what it was like when their Grandparents were at school. They discovered that some did not have a uniform at their schools, they did not do cooking and they did not have Forest School. The children shared some of their harvest cooking and everyone tried some school garden chutney and everyone enjoyed some marrow cake made by Mrs Deasy! We ended the week with a Philosophy for children (P4C) afternoon. Each term we have a whole school philosophy afternoon. Pupils watch a short film clip or listen to a story that encourages them to form questions around a moral dilemma. The themes are debated in their classrooms as an aid to formulating the questions. It is stipulated that there are no wrong or right answers but it is an opportunity for children to apply logic in order to produce reasoned viewpoints. P4C sessions enable us to provide a safe space to explore issues. The sessions also allow us time to focus on developing pupils' key thinking, communication and social skills. We used the book 'A Walk with Vanessa' as the stimulus for this term's P4C session and helped us to focus on the protected characteristic of race and the theme of belonging. This book is a story about a simple act of kindness and shows how the actions of one individual can inspire an entire community.

On Friday 3rd November we have a professional photographer spending the day with us to take photographs of the children for our new website. We are very excited about photographing all the wonderful things we do at St James' so that we can celebrate what we do as a community. The PTA have kindly agreed to fund this project and we are very grateful to them. I know that the children will have fun and we look forward to seeing the results.

Safeguarding

The following is advice from Brake, the road safety charity:

Children under eight should always be accompanied by and hold hands with an adult around roads, particularly when crossing. When your child reaches the age of eight, you should consider whether to allow them to walk independently. It can be a tough decision as you will need to consider their development and weigh up the benefits of them being active and healthy with traffic danger in your area. When you decide to let your child walk independently, remind them about the importance of crossing safely using the Green Cross Code, paying attention to the road, and help them to plan the safest possible route (along quiet, slow roads with pavements or trafficfree paths) to school, the park or their friends' houses.


