## Headteacher's Message

We continue our journey through Lent.

This week KS2 had an assembly about FairTrade and they hopefully now understand how buying Fairtrade products protects people and the planet.



Thank you to Mrs Connolly for accompanying the Junior Travel Ambassadors (JTAs) to their meeting at the Bromley Central Library this week. The role of a JTA is to explain to all the children at St James' the need to stay safe on the roads. They also try to help the environment by promoting public transport, cycling, scooting or walking. Thank you to all the children that attended the Lenten Reflection Sessions this week. The children enjoyed listening to God's word and discussed what it meant to them. The group reflected on how to treat others and to share God's love. They celebrated that Jesus is the light of the world who shines upon us. They discussed how they can be rays of sunshine to others throughout the day. It was a very special week.


Dr Jan Bajorek visited Year 5 to talk about his adventures in Peru. The children learnt that Peru is the third biggest country in South America with a population of 32million. The children thoroughly enjoyed the visit especially learning that oranges grown in Peru are green as they do not get enough sunlight. They did not enjoy learning that guinea pigs are a delicacy! We really appreciate Dr Bajorek giving up his time.

Year 5 are taking part in five interactive workshops organised by Climate Ed. Climate Ed is a charity offering free education so that children learn about carbon literacy and climate action. Some of the questions the children will answer and discuss are: What is a carbon footprint and how can we measure it? Which has more climate impact: a banana or an ice cream? Could London really go underwater?



This week some Year 5 pupils attended a Maths Masterclass at Bromley High School. The focus was on tessellations. Tessellations are everywhere. A tessellation is one or more shapes fitted together with no gaps. The pupils investigated what shapes tessellate. They studied periodic tessellations with regular and irregular shapes. A periodic irregular Tessellation is a repeated pattern made of an irregular shape. This then progressed to studying aperiodic shapes that tessellate. They enjoyed looking at the work of Maurice C Escher, a Dutch artist who created many artworks that included geometric techniques such as reflection symmetry and tessellations.





A representative from The Cardinal Hume Charity led a KS2 Assembly this week to thank the children for their donations to the charity. The children learnt about their work and how their donation from the KS1 Nativity plays and KS2 Advent Concert would support young people who found themselves homeless.



On Wednesday Y3 went on a trip to Chislehurst Caves for a guided tour of the network of tunnels that extends a vast distance underneath the roads of Chislehurst. The children learned about rocks and soils and Early Man and were very brave as much of the system is in total darkness with only lanterns lighting the way. The tunnels are an amazing resource for families to enjoy and are open Wednesday—Sunday with a fabulous café to visit.



On Wednesday the French Ambassadors had a great day at the Institut Francais in Kensington. The children had written letters applying for their role as ambassadors and this is the first event that we have planned for them. They spent the morning in a classroom doing some translation, speaking and completing vocabulary exercises about the French film Ernest et Celestine. Then they watched a film in the Cine Lumiere, a cinema in the Institut. They had a wonderful day and we look forward to planning more MFL events in the future. Thank you to Madame Batten and Miss Atkinson.





We were visited by our Governors on Tuesday. In the morning Mr Gribben carried out a Health and Safety Walk with Mr Jawed and me to ensure that we were keeping staff and children safe. Then in the afternoon Governors met with Mrs Richards to hear all about SEND. Governors also visited classes to see how we support children with SEND.

On Wednesday I met with a group of KS2 girls and then a group of KS2 boys to hear about their views on how we keep children safe in school and how we ensure everyone is treated fairly and with respect.

We also celebrated Maths Day this week. Please see the attached newsletter for information about this. Thank you to Mrs Richards for organising this.

We ended our week by watching Year 3's class assembly. This was a fantastic celebration of all their hard work. Well done to Year 3 and thank you to Miss Spencer - Boyce, Mrs Bromfiels and Mrs Wakefield for organising this.

On Thursday 7th March it is World Book Day. To help celebrate this, it would be lovely for children to come into school dressed as something to do with books, words or characters. This can be as simple or as complicated as you would like and there is no expectation to buy new dressing up clothes for this. We would also like your child to bring into school their favourite book from home to share with children from other classes. (It can also be a book from the classroom!) Please make sure the book is labelled in some way with your child's name if they are bringing it in from home. In class, we will be sharing the same book throughout the school and getting together to discuss our ideas with other classes. At the end of the day, children will be bringing home their World Book Day tokens that will allow them to receive a free book from participating stockists or it can act as a discount voucher towards other books. We look forward to seeing the children dressed ready to celebrate all things books!

This week we were sent the new official portrait of His Majesty the King. The portrait, taken at Windsor Castle last year by photographer Hugo Burnand shows His Majesty wearing a Royal Navy uniform of an Admiral of the Fleet and official medals and decorations. The large framed portrait has been sent to public buildings across the United Kingdom as part of a scheme to celebrate the new reign.



Thank you to the parents who have already attended the virtual online safety talk delivered by ECP. If you have not watched this invaluable session please see the joining information in the safeguarding section below. The company have extended the availability of the course until Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> March.

On another note, attached to this newsletter is a copy of our Lock Down Policy. Schools are asked to ensure that they are able to secure their site, with pupils, staff and volunteers safely inside should the need arise. Please read our policy. We need to practise this annually in order to ensure that everyone knows what to do in a Lock Down. We will be holding a practice before Easter. We will tell the children on the day that we do this and that it is a practice. We will do everything we can not to frighten the children and will use our sensitivity to this end. We have carried this out for the last few years and no children have ever been upset or worried.

KS2 have been completing a questionnaire this week about any incidents of bullying that they have witnessed or have experienced in and out of school. We are in the process of talking to any children individually who are concerned about this. I will share the results of this questionnaire with parents when I have collated the data.

We were delighted to receive a letter from Damian Hinds, the Minister for Schools to congratulate us on our KS2 results last year and to explain that this put us in the top 1% of primary schools in the country. Please see the attached letter. Congratulations to the staff of St James' and to the children who were in Y6 in the last academic year!
