# Headteacher's Message


Dear Parents,

What an amazing start to the week we had with the Year 5 and Year 6 Cross Country runners at Crystal Palace. 62 schools competed and our Y5 boys came 1<sup>st</sup> and our Year 5 Girls came 3<sup>rd</sup>. With the results also from Year 6 we won the Small School Competition! A huge congratulations to all the children taking part and representing St James' so well. Thank you to Mrs Wilson, Mrs Martin, Mrs Bromfield and of course Mrs Connolly for helping to make this a success. I would also like to thank Mr and Mrs Kelly for volunteering to prepare the children for the event over many wet and cold afterschool sessions! A huge well done to everyone involved. There are many proud parents and staff.

This week children have been taking part in money workshops provided by HSBC bank. Thank you to Mrs Richards for arranging this. Reception class had a story time session based on making choices about what to do with their money. Year 1 talked about how money has evolved through the ages and looked at recognising the value of coins. Year 2 were introduced to the idea of a bank account and how we get paid. Year 3 considered how to save for something they really want. Year 4 looked at the the difference between debit and credit cards and how to keep them secure. Year 5 looked at how spending decisions can impact communities. Finally, Year 6 looked at the world of work, banking, borrowing and saving and why having a bank account is important. #### **Word on Wednesday**

The Wednesday Word is KINDNESS. This Sunday we celebrate the feast of Christ the King. In the Gospel, Jesus describes what will happen when he comes again at the end of time. Like a shepherd who calls his sheep to follow him, Jesus invites people to be with him forever. The only requirement is that we should have looked after our neighbour in need. We talked to the children about how every act of kindness done to someone else is also done to Jesus.

## **Safeguarding**

Children may compare the number of friends or followers that they have online with others. This can lead to 'friend envy' as they can see this as a sign of popularity. This could lead to children showing signs of jealously and resorting to sending friend requests to people they do not know that well in a desperate bid to increase their own status online. Another way that children can increase their following is by leaving their accounts open so that they can be easily found, and anybody can view their posts. This is in the hope that other users will like their posts and decide to follow them, therefore increasing their numbers. Once again, this can leave children vulnerable to being followed by people who have dishonest intentions. Children who feel under pressure to increase their friend count or want to increase their following as quickly as possible can be vulnerable to collecting 'fake' friends. Just like increasing followers can bring a sense of happiness and satisfaction, so the loss of followers can cause children to suffer feelings of sadness and rejection. Depending on how invested children are in their social media activities, this could influence their attitude and behaviour online and potentially have a negative impact on their mental health and wellbeing. The best way to know who your child is friends with online or who follows them is to be their friend or follower yourself. This will allow you to see who your child is engaging with most online or open up discussions about how they know certain people they have added to their network. Your child's behaviour online should always be treated as an extension of their behaviour offline. Discuss with your child the pitfalls of trying to be somebody they are not and that trying to please everybody will only make them unhappy. Tell them that they should be proud of who they are and that they should always behave in an appropriate and responsible way when posting content online.


