Headteacher's Message

Thank you to everyone who supported our Jeans for Genes Day last week. We raised £157.54

On Monday in the whole school assembly we met the Year 4 and Year 5 Mini Vinnies. The Mini Vinnies are quite literally mini St. Vincent de Paul's and are children based in schools and parishes. They come together to form a part of the St. Vincent de Paul Society, a voluntary organisation dedicated to tackling poverty in all its forms. Mini Vinnies meet to pray, discuss and support however they can to help make a difference in their communities.

This term we continue to think about the word courage and what this means. Children nominate their peers who show courage through the week. These nominations are shared in assembly and displayed in our Catholic Virtues Book and in the hall.

A representative from CAFOD visited the school to lead a KS2 assembly and a Year 6 workshop. The KS2 children saw how CAFOD supports others around the world. The Catholic Social Principles of Human Dignity and Option for the Poor were highlighted in their presentation.



Year 6 then had a workshop led by CAFOD. They looked at how communities make decisions about the projects they want to implement and how they decide upon these. They used their knowledge of Catholic Social Teaching to help them be project managers!





I met with the PTA this week. The PTA is such a huge part of our St James' community and we are indebted to all their hard work over the years in fundraising for the children and in making memorable social events. On Friday Y3 visited the library and returned to school with some exciting books.

Throughout October we will be marking Black History Month. We are celebrating the achievements of significant and inspiring figures such as Nelson Mandela, Rosa Parks and Mary Seacole. The culture, history and achievements of black and ethnic minority communities will take centre stage. Children will learn about a wide range of topics during Black History Month, including the civil rights movement and heroes of sport, music, entertainment and the world of academia. Please remember that the deadline for nominations for a new Parent Governor is at noon on Tuesday 3rd October. Parents should have received a letter of invitation, nomination form, disqualification form and Governor Allowance Policy but please see the office if you did not receive these. Should you wish to discuss what the role would entail please do contact our Chair of Governors, Mary Hutchinson, via the school office.

I would like to remind parents how important it is for children to attend school regularly and avoid any unnecessary absence. Please remember that if your child is absent for the day they have missed two sessions. If your child wakes up unwell but feels better during the day please bring them in for the afternoon session that starts at 1:15. Any child that has 95% attendance or below is closely monitored by the school and if attendance drops below 90% we will contact you to discuss this. Over the course of a year the following attendance equates to a certain number of days of school missed.

98% attendance = 4 days absent from school 95% attendance = 9 days absent from school 90% attendance = 20 days absent from school 85% attendance = 5 ½ weeks absent from school (nearly one-half term) 80% attendance = 7 ½ weeks absent from school

We held a Fire Practice recently and all the children were out of the building and accounted for in four minutes. We obviously take Fire Safety very seriously and we wanted the children to all recognise the Fire Alarm noise and know what to do if the alarm is sounded.

The month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. Praying the Rosary helps children to grow in faith. Our Lady of Fatima asked us to pray the Rosary every day and this is something that you could try to do as a family over the next few weeks. Mrs Wilson will be leading a Rosary Group each day next week at 8:30am for KS2 children if they would like to attend. Mrs Wilson will meet the KS2 children at the gate if they would like to join her.

We look forward to welcoming KS2 parents to school on Wednesday at 6:30 as we will be explaining how parents can support their children at home with reading and reading comprehension. You are welcome to come along and meet the KS2 teachers and ask any questions that you have.

Harvest Mass Donations to Bromley Foodbank

Our whole school Harvest Mass will take place at church on Thursday 5th October at 9.30am. We are asking our children to donate one item which they will bring to school and take to church on this day to place in front of the altar. After Mass, the food will be collected by the Justice, Peace and the Integrity of Creation Group of St James' Church (JPIC) who have kindly offered to transport the donations to the Bromley Foodbank for distribution to people who are in need within our local community. The Bromley Foodbank now designates schools as certain category foods. We have been nominated as a Long Life Fruit Juice or **Shampoo School.** The Bromley Foodbank would be very grateful for any of these donations. The Foodbank have also requested that children, if possible, bring a 'bag for life' to school to help transport the items. The foodbank helps individuals and families in crisis, through the provision of emergency food supplies. The foodbank is part of The Trussell Trust's network of 428 foodbanks. In 2022/23, they provided 2,986,203 three-day emergency food supplies and support to UK people in crisis. Of these, 1,139,553 were distributed for

children. Please can you advise the office if you are able to walk with the children, to and from church on Thursday 5th October. Thank you for your cooperation and generosity.


OTHER NEWS
