Headteacher's Message

Dear Parents,

We started our busy week with Health Screening for children in Reception and Year 6.

I hope that you found the Open Classroom session on Monday after school useful and that you were able to see the children's work.

All week we have been raising awareness for the annual Children's Mental Health Week. This is a mental health awareness week that empowers, equips and gives a voice to all children in the UK. Year 3 completed some positive acclamations to celebrate Children's Mental Health Week.



They also went outside to carry out a winter scavenger hunt. During their time outdoors they focused their senses on what they could hear, smell and feel. In our busy world, we often do not allow ourselves time to experience all that our outdoor space can offer us. Upon their return the children created their own outdoor creatures.





Safer Internet Day took place on Tuesday and the theme was 'Inspiring Change. Making a difference, managing influence and navigating change online'. This year the focus was on a child's perspective of new and emerging technology, using the internet to make change for the better, the changes children want to see online and the things that can influence and change the way children think, feel and act online and offline. All children watched a virtual talk given by Education Child Protection Ltd about internet safety. This was kindly funded by the PTA. Please watch the virtual talk for parents. The details were sent out this week and are in the safeguarding section of this newsletter. Reception watched their online video about keeping safe online. They learnt what personal information is and how important it is to not give out their name, age, address or their school.

All the children talked about who their trusted adults. They could explain that if they saw something when they are online that worries them or they are unsure about then they would tell a trusted adult. They also found out about CEOP and how they make sure children are safe online.

Mrs Wilson this week attended a two day RE Conference in Aylesford and will be feeding back to staff on what was discussed at the conference.

Chess Medals were awarded recently by Chess Club. This club goes from strength to strength and we are so proud of the Chess Club members for all of their achievements. We fortunately run many clubs before and after school and at lunchtime. The children listened to a talk by The London Borough of Bromley and their initiative to tackle loneliness.



I held a Student Council Meeting this week. It is always good to meet with the class representatives and to hear about their ideas. The Year 2 Class Assembly took place on Friday and we were delighted to hear about everything that they have been learning. Thank you Year 2.



Year 1 visited the library and had a wonderful time choosing books.



In the Philosophy for Children (P4C) session the children focused on the protected characteristic of gender. The book 'Pink is for Boys' by Robb Pearlman was used as the stimulus for their discussion. The children shared their thoughts on the book and these thoughts were then turned to questions with each class voting on one question to discuss in depth. The book enabled the children to question how gender should not discriminate you. The question chosen by each class will be displayed on the P4C display in the hall.

We have had a few incidents recently where children have been scratched accidentally so I would kindly ask that parents ensure that their children's nails are short. Thank you.

This Lent we are supporting the Catholic Children's Society Appeal. The charity was founded in 1859 and is one of the oldest charities supporting

disadvantaged children and families in the UK. The Catholic Children's Society supports families across London and the South East. They work with individuals of all faiths and none; their sole aim is to help those in greatest need. The charity has been inundated with requests and in recent months they have provided over £60,000 of emergency funding to support families in crisis. They are helping disadvantaged families with food costs and bills so that families can feed their children and keep them warm. The Catholic Children's Society's vision is a world where every child gets the support that they need to achieve their potential, creating a better society for all. Their mission is to bring hope and positive change to children and families. Their work is informed by Catholic Social Teachings and the core values of integrity, compassion, inclusion and partnership. All of the children brought home a box this week that they can fill during Lent with loose change or money that they donate from giving up something. We ask that children return their boxes to school on Monday 25th March.

We are supporting two student teachers this term and we sadly say goodbye to Miss Smarth on Friday. She has been working in Year 1 and we wish her the very best for the future. We are pleased that Miss Smith continues in Year 2 after half term.

Word on Wednesday

The Wednesday Word is COMPASSION. Jesus has compassion for all those who are left out: he came to take away fear and loneliness – to help people feel loved and accepted. We asked the children if they had ever been left out. We also asked them if they could remember a time when someone showed them compassion and really cared about their situation and feelings. To be compassionate is to share someone's suffering - to feel sorrow for their situation and to do something about it. We discussed how we could do that.

On Tuesday 6th February it was Safer Internet Day. The PTA generously paid for all classes to have an online presentation this week by Education Child Protection Ltd on internet safety. We have used this company before and their online talks are very informative. Each talk is age appropriate and children had an opportunity to ask their teacher questions at the end of the talk. As well as funding a session for staff training the PTA are also paying for an Online Safety Presentation for parents. This virtual one-hour session will be available from Monday 5th February to Sunday 3rd March. I would encourage all parents to view this online safety training talk as parents in the past have found it extremely useful and feedback has been very positive.
