Thank you to Mr Wakefield, Mr Gajraj and Mrs Connolly for their work organising this and to Miss Spencer-Boyce for taking the children.



We are working with the Warren Road Teaching Alliance and this year we were lucky enough to attend the Coding Challenge Day with some Year 5 children as our representatives. The children spent the day working on various different software and hardware and had a great day solving problems. Thank you to Miss Atkinson for organising this and to Mrs Pearce for attending with the children.



We were treated this week to a performance from the Helen O'Grady Drama Club. It was great to see how the children have developed in confidence over the term. I know how hard they have worked and all their hard work has certainly paid off. Well done!



This week saw some judges from the Coolings Garden Centre come to see our garden. They were really impressed by what they saw and were pleased to hear about our determination to reduce, reuse and recycle in the garden. They shared our disappointment that the CDs that we have displayed have not managed to scare off our rather persistent and hungry Magpies! However, our use of rainwater, compost and natural mulches to sustain the garden through the driest and hottest weeks of June and July was commended. They have very kindly invited us to an awards ceremony in early September at which we hope to be recognised in the Best School Allotment category.

We were delighted to receive our KS2 SATs results this week which were all well above the National Average and are so proud of our Year 6 children. I hope they are as delighted with their results as we are. The Year 6 children deserve to be congratulated on such impressive results and for their hard work and sustained focus throughout their time at St James'. The children can all move onto secondary school with a good foundation which will lead to further future successes I am sure. We are very proud of the progress every single member of our Year 6 class has made and of course we remember that much of their learning in Year 3 and Year 4 was interrupted.

Congratulations Year 6!

Our KS2 results are as follows:

97% reached expected in Reading and 72% reached Greater Depth

94% reached expected in English grammar, punctuation and spelling and 75% reached Greater Depth

100% reached expected in Mathematics and 59% reached greater depth

97% reached expected in Writing and 44% reached greater depth

97% reached expected in Science

I attended the final PTA meeting of this year and passed on my thanks to them for all that they do. The children and staff are so grateful for their work and the money that they raise. We have much to be grateful for at St James' and the PTA is certainly one of those things. Many of the PTA are working parents and they are still able to support the school in such an incredible way. Much of their work goes unnoticed but it is certainly appreciated. A huge thank you to everyone who has organised fundraising events this year or supported the fundraising efforts. Thank you particularly to Mr Colonnese, Mrs Pavia and Mrs Saunders who do so much to make everything run so smoothly.

This week teachers met with me and Mrs Richards, the SENCO, to talk in depth about each child so that information is passed on to the next teacher. This enables all staff to start back in September with detailed knowledge of their individual children. As you know children have also been spending time with their new teachers so that they were all able to get to know one another before September.

Today we said thank you to Mrs Le Cuirot for her work in Year 2 over the last 2 years. We are very grateful to her for her commitment to the children and for all that she has done. We are not saying goodbye to her though as she will hopefully cover classes if needed next year.

This Week's Word is LISTENING. As we all know, children love to be listened to and it helps them to grow in self-esteem. If, from a young age, they know that they are truly listened to, they are far more likely to keep listening to us as they mature. In this Sunday's Gospel, we hear Jesus inviting us to listen to him and act upon his words. He reminds us how important it is to take time to listen to God and to act upon what we hear. This helps us to make wise and safe life choices

Safeguarding

The online world gives us access to a huge amount of information and services but the scale of information available also means that there is content that is inappropriate for children. What is or isn't appropriate is up to individual parents to decide, and could be based on things like age, ability and family values. Parental controls allow you to block and filter upsetting or inappropriate content. They work across your WiFi, phone network, individual apps and devices. Parental controls can help you to plan what time of day your child can go online and how long for, create content filters to block apps that may have inappropriate content and manage the content different family members can see. FREE SCHOOL MEALS

I want to share some news about school lunches with you before the summer holidays begin. The Mayor of London is ensuring **all primary school children** who attend state schools in London will receive free school meals for the full academic year, starting this September. This means that your child and all children in our school will be entitled to free school meals next year.

If your child is also eligible for extra funding it is really important to still complete the Government's registration form as the extra funding for schools for your child is worth £1,300 per year. If you think that you are entitled to further support please contact Bromley for further information. The registration process is straightforward and confidential.

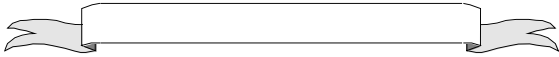
