

Word on Wednesday

This Week's Word is **FRIENDSHIP**. In this Sunday's Gospel, we read about Jesus praying for his friends. This is after the last supper and before leaving his friends he is preparing them for the difficult time to come. We talked to the children about how friendship is one of life's great blessings and Jesus' friendship is offered to us all. When we have good friendships, we feel happy and fulfilled because we know that we are loved and supported. We also discussed the qualities that make a good friend such as kindness, honesty, trust and loyalty. Through friendship, we can show that we are part of God's family, loving and working together to make the world a better place. We asked the children how they can deepen their friendship with Jesus and we prayed together for our friends.

Safeguarding

When introducing young children to road awareness it is important to bear in mind that they perceive traffic in different ways to adults. They cannot always judge the speed or distance of vehicles or where the sound is coming from because their peripheral vision is two-thirds that of an adult. Children can also be easily distracted.

What you can do:

- set an example: stop, look and listen, do not take risks and avoid using your mobile phone when crossing the road
- bend down to their eye level to get an idea of what they can and cannot see
- find a safe place to cross where you can see easily, ideally at a crossing or away from parked cars and when it's clear, walk straight across in quiet areas, gradually allow your children to practice making decisions about where and when to cross the road.

OTHER NEWS


