GARDENING NEWS

Two weeks ago today, Mrs Deasy and her gardening volunteers, Mrs Charlesworth and Mr Bishop, came into Year 3 to support their learning around soils for their Science topic. They started the gardening session with a talk by Mrs Deasy and by watching two time lapse videos showing how peas develop over a period of days. The children were then invited to plant their own seeds in labelled pots using recycled soil (coir taken from the husk of coconuts) which were then take to the school greenhouse. The subsequent plants from these seeds will be potted on into a larger container to reside in the quad between Year 3 and Year 6 providing flowers and scent in early summer.

The children also planted up a 'control' experiment - pea seeds were sown in coir, cotton wool and regular growing compost and placed on the class window ledge under the watchful eye of Jaydon, the class Eco Council representative. Thus far, the peas that have grown the most successfully are those in the cotton wool and Mrs Deasy has had a difficult job persuading the class that this is not the ideal medium and no, we should not be growing all our vegetables in this way!

A further report will follow when we successfully plant out our seedlings in early spring

The uniform sale will be after half term, date TBC.


The PTA needs a volunteer to lead the coordination of organising the Family Disco on the 4th March.
