Headteacher's Message

Dear Parents,

I want to start by saying a huge thank you to everyone who was involved in making the PTA Summer Fair a fantastic success. It was such a great day with a lovely atmosphere. Many people have commented on the strong community feeling that they experienced. It was great to see previous families and new families all enjoying themselves. The PTA ensures that the Fair runs smoothly and makes the organisation of it look effortless when we all know that of course it takes such commitment and hard work. We are so lucky to have such an amazing PTA. I want to particularly thank Mr Coloneese, Mrs Adebanji and Mrs Saunders for their tireless work in making this event such a massive success. I know that they do so much that goes unnoticed behind the scenes.

Our Bromley Planter unfortunately did not win a prize but it certainly looked superb and we were very proud of it. It celebrated the Catholic values of our school and I hope that you got a chance to visit Bromley to see it. It has now been returned safely to us and we are going to gift it to the residents of Southmore Court to look after.

Year 5 and Year 6 have been busy this week attending Finance Workshops and NSPCC Workshops. During the NSPCC workshops the children discussed Childline and how the charity is available to listen to children ever day throughout the year. They remembered the number of 0800 1111. The NSPCC representatives reminded the children that if they feel unsafe they must talk to a trusted adult.



In the HSBC finance workshop, Year 5 discussed household budgeting. They calculated the cost of essential living outgoings and then deducted this from their estimated monthly salaries. The children were surprised by how little they had left to spend on themselves at the end of the month.



Following on from Year 6 Career's Day, the HSBC team talked to them about their future employment and how salaries are paid and what Gross and Net pay means. It was really interesting finding out about all the career choices that the children have in mind and how articulate they are about financial issues.



I want to thank all the parents and volunteers who gave up their time on Friday to talk to Year 6 about their work. The children met bankers, solicitors, paramedics, nurses, vets, radiographers, language teachers, composers, engineers and people involved in event planning and digital marketing. It really was a remarkable event and I want to thank Mrs Connolly for organising this.



Reception Class visited the church this week and met with Father David who talked to them about Baptism. Thank you to Father David for this and to Mrs Richards for organising this.



This week we were happy to welcome Jim Buttress, RHS judge, and Leigh-Anne Bovis from Ruxley Manor Garden Centre. They came to present prizes to members of the school Gardening Club. The club won Bronze and a £30 voucher for their beehive planter and the school garden, won Silver and a £40 voucher for Best School Allotment. I would like to take this opportunity to thank two grandparents, Mr John Bishop and Mrs Kate Charlesworth, who support the school each Friday, enabling our children to sow, plant and grow within our school garden. This has involved research, presenting assemblies at school and attending and presenting workshops to other Bromley schools. 4.15-5.00pm - First Strings – for beginners to players of approx. Grade 1 level


5.15-6.15pm - Second Strings – for players of approx. Grades 1-4 level
