Spring Term Outline

Welcome to our Curriculum Outline for the coming term.

English	The children will focus on a variety of writing genres such as story writing, biographies, playscripts and persuasive writing. They will			
	develop their writing by focusing on using different sentence openers and understanding the importance of proof reading and editing their			
	writing. The pupils will focus on using a variety of punctuation such as: commas, dashes, brackets to indicate parenthesis and use the			
	perfect form of verbs to mark relationships of time and cause. They will also understand the difference between direct and indirect speech.			
Maths	The key areas in Maths for the Spring term will be:			
	 Multiplying and dividing using formal methods. 			
	Identify equivalent fractions			
	Multiply unit and non-unit fractions by an integer			
	Multiply mixed numbers by integers			
	Calculate fractions of an amount			
	Solve problems using fractions			
	Order decimals up to 2 decimal places			
	Write decimals as fractions including thousandths.			
	Round decimals			
	Order and compare decimals			
	Write percentages as fractions and decimals			
	 Recognise simple equivalent fractions and represent them as decimals and percentages. 			
RE	The children will develop their RE skills including:			
	Continue to study more complex scriptures.			
	Show understanding by making links between beliefs and life.			
	• The chance to express a reasoned preference and begin to arrive at informed judgements.			
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	These skills are developed through studying the topics Inspirational People and Reconciliation from the Way, The Truth, The Life Scheme.			
	Year 5 will also study the Islam faith focusing on the Mosque and the Prayer at Home.			
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Science	Forest School	Geography
The focus is on studying forces focusing on air resistance and water resistance, friction, levers and pulleys. In the second half of the spring term, the pupils will study the Earth, Sun and Moon focusing on the movement of the planets in the solar system, the movement of the Moon and day and night.	Children will be attending Forest School for the first half of the Spring term.	The focus in geography is: Where in the world is South America? The pupils will locate countries of South America on a map. They will learn about key physical and human characteristics of South America such as climate, population, trade and industry and mountain regions. They will then carry out an indepth study of Brazil.
Computing The pupils will develop their computing skills by focusing on HTML Coding. They will identify the key code of HTML language and use this to create their own website promoting the school.	DT The children will study tapestry focusing on the Bayeux Tapestry. They will experiment with different tapestry techniques such as quilting and sewing. The pupils will then design and complete a tapestry depicting an epic adventure.	History There will be no History topic taught this term as we will be focusing on our geography skills.
Music The pupils will be focusing on Musical Theatre. This includes listening to different pieces from musicals and identifying different types of musical songs. They will then be using a piece of music to write their own lyrics and own musical song about a Journey. The pupils will begin to use standard notation to record their melodies.	The children will develop their PE skills through participation in Hockey, Netball and Gymnastics.	PSHE & RHE E Safety – The focus will be on online reputation and online bullying. The pupils will be able to describe ways that information about anyone online can be used by others to make judgments about an individual and why these may be incorrect. They will describe how what one person perceives as playful joking and teasing (including 'banter') might be experienced by others as bullying. RHE lessons will be enhanced by the use of Ten Ten Resources. The topics studied this term will be: Self-Talk Sharing isn't always caring. Cyberbullying Our Catholic Social Teaching Principles.
