History - Year 3 have loved learning about Ancient Greece this term. I am seeing many historians in the making. We have learnt about Greek Gods and Goddesses, the Ancient Olympics, Sparta Vs Athens and the legacy that the Ancient Greeks left behind. We also combined cooking this term with our history topic by making a delicious Greek Salad and hummus to feast on at our Ancient Greek Day.

Art – Our topic this term was 'Recycled Art', something the whole class feel very passionate about. We took something ugly (a plastic bottle or plastic milk cartoon) and recycled it into something beautiful. Our colourful fish also serve as a reminder of the danger of the amount plastic in our oceans.

Computing – Within ICT this term we have looked at PowerPoints. It has also been lovely to see the children transfer the skills they are learning in ICT and applying them to their

homework. Touch typing skills are still being developed and is something that is really simple and easy to practice at home.
